A family makes around ₹50,000-60,000 from kanwars in about two-and-a-half months.

**Haridwar:** Several Muslim families in Haridwar, the site of a massive annual fair, have started making a hundred in Javaliyan's India. Over several hundreds in Mausoleum, near Roorkee, apart from several in Nozhaabad in Uttar Pradesh's Bijnor, get abuzz with activities two months ahead of the Kanwar yatra. People who work for the rest of the year as masons, carpenters or labourers, get busy making 'kanwars', the colourful bamboo and paper installation carried by kanwariyas, the Shiva devotees to come to Haridwar on foot to collect Gangajati.

Forsman, a local resident, said, "All members of a family including women and children, join in the making of kanwars. It's a yearly ritual for us. The families have joined hands together, which are sent to shop at Tapovan across the Kali-Pauri for sale. The preparation starts at least two months in advance. We believe around 75 to 80 lakh kanwars are sold during the Kanwar yatra. A family makes around ₹50,000 to ₹60,000 from these in about two and a half months."

However, the business of making kanwars is often difficult and has low returns. Zulfikar Ali, another resident of Indira Basti, said, "Most kanwar artisans find it hard to make ends meet."

## Preventive Action Taken Against 300

300 individuals, 120 in the city and the rest in rural areas, had prior records related to cow slaughter and were booked under section 161 of the CrPC. Muzaffarnagar shares a border with Uttaranchal, used by hundreds of thousands of Kanwar pilgrims from Delhi, Haryana, Rajasthan, and Uttar Pradesh.

According to SP (city) Santayaran Parajput, only shops located on the routes where Kanwar activities are taking place have been instructed not to sell non-vegetarian items. "Preventive action is being taken against those involved in cow slaughter," he added.

As Muzaffarnagar lacks a slaughterhouse, meat is sourced from neighbouring districts. However, this supply has been disrupted due to measures taken by meat traders. To convey a strong message to these traders and shopkeepers, the police have taken preventive actions in 300 individual outlets of involvement in cow slaughter, some of whom own meat shops.

## Saharanpur DM makes chapatis for kanwariyas at camp, video goes viral

**Meerut:** From 'push varsha' (flower showers) on kanwariyas from helicopters to foot massages, bureaucrats in Uttar Pradesh are finding newer ways to conduct 'sava' (service) at the annual kanwar yatra in which lakhs of Shiva devotees from across north India fetch water from the Ganga in Haridwar to offer at temples in their respective home towns. In the latest such instance, Saharanpur district magistrate (DM), Dinesh Chandra, could be seen making chapatis at a kanwar camp where he had gone for an inspection of the arrangements. Video

showing the DM making rotis on a tawa soon went viral on social media.

Chandra told TOI on Friday, "The kanwar yatra is a large-scale event for which all government departments, social workers, donation seekers, and others contribute as per their capacities. When I visit these camps, I automatically feel a sense of service. And it's not just about me, I think it's there with everyone who is present. Besides, my actions distributing food and making roti were also aimed at lifting the spirits of the workers and other staff members who are busy round the clock ensuring the best facilities to the devotees." The move by bureaucrats to integrate themselves with the yatra had started in 2018, when the then-additional director general (Meerut zone), Prashant Kumar (now DG, law and order of UP) decided to shower flower petals on the kanwariyas from a helicopter. In 2019, the then-Shamli SP Ajay Kumar was seen giving a foot massage to a kanwariya at a camp in Shamli. **Sandeep Rai**

Around 3,000 police personnel have been deployed across the district for security. Additionally, 1,279 CCTV cameras have been installed throughout the district, with 369 connected to headquarters and other districts.

## 'Unable to keep record of pilgrims who pass by'

During the kanwar yatra, the highway usually gets divided into two for commuters and devotees. Commuters are compelled to take alternate routes due to diversions. During the peak of the yatra, only devotee vehicles, such as mini trucks, are allowed to pass. This leads to operational revenue loss. However, the loss is only due to traffic diversions and has nothing to do with the holy yatra and rituals," Chaudhary said.

He added, "We also remove sensors and cameras to prevent damage and theft. In most cases, we are unable to keep a record of the pilgrims who pass through. As the company has to bear the entire loss as the toll becomes non-functional for at least three to four days. On a normal working day, around 15,000 vehicles pass on weekends, the number goes up to 40,000-40,000 on the rest commercial vehicles – with a daily collection of tax of around ₹30 lakh to ₹40 lakh." Moreover, Chaudhary pointed out that after the commencement of the Delhi-Meet Expressway, the traffic has increased by 30%.

"Earlier, commuters places like Delhi had only one route from Rajnagar to Munirabad via Nadia and Motihari. A large number of cars from Bihar took the Gorakhpur stretch connecting Munirabad to Haridwar, which skips the toll. But, as the Delhi-Meet Expressway ends at Paraijap, commuters going to Haridwar through Muzaffarnagar and Roorkee, pass through NH-58, which proved beneficial to us. According to our analysis, 2023 will record the highest loss till date as footfall has increased," he added. Notably, around 50,000 vehicles are denied entry for three to four days by the security personnel on the NH-58, a route that connects Delhi to Badridham via Meerut-Muzaffarnagar-Roorkee-Haridwar and Rishikesh, since pilgrims use it to reach the Ganga in Haridwar and return home.

## Raj devotees carry holy water to two villages in 500km pilgrimage

**Shamli:** A group of 12 pilgrims from Rajasthan has embarked on a remarkable 500-km journey from Haridwar to Haridwar, carrying holy water from the Ganges for Lord Hari Krishna, a postman, the pilgrimage holds great significance for villagers eagerly awaiting their arrival.

For the past 12 years, villagers have followed the tradition of bringing holy water from Ganga water container on a tractor trolley while the group members carry these giant kanvars on their heads in religious processions.

"In our area, only a few people participate in the Kanwar Yatra. But in recent years, the youth have become more aware of Hindu culture, which is a positive development. Every year, the entire village encourages the youth to undertake the yatra. Upon their return, a Kalash Yatra is also carried out with DJ music, and everyone collectively performs Jabbabishekh," said Sushil Joshi, a local leader and social worker from Thalakarvillage.
