Flight for SA, Eng former cricketers levels snag

KANPUR: A special Indigo flight that was to take former South African and English international cricketers to India for the remaining Road Safety World Series matches could not take off from Chakeri airport in Kanpur on Friday because of a technical glitch, said officials aware of the development.

The engine of the aircraft failed after landing, said two officials, adding the subsequent take-off could have been dangerous. As the special flight was on the runway, a return flight from Mumbai that was scheduled to land hovered in the skies for long before it was sent to Chaudhary Charan Singh International airport in Lucknow.

The passengers, who were to board this flight from Mumbai, created a ruckus at the Kanpur airport as they were told their flight was cancelled and the aircraft would transport the cricketers to Lucknow.

Later, it was decided the

teams would go by another aircraft and other passengers were sent to Lucknow airport by special buses, said people aware of the matter, adding they would go to Mumbai by a 10pm flight.

Then, as also decided to send the former cricketers to Lucknow by road to enable them to board a flight from there.

Several international teams comprising legendary former cricketers had played matches at Green Park in Kanpur till September 15. A special flight on Thursday had taken the Indian and Australian teams, comprising greats like Sachin Tendulkar, Yuvraj Singh and Brett Lee from Chakeri airport to Indore.

Two other teams — South Africa and England — were to leave for Indore on Friday.

The cricketers had boarded the plane but the take-off was aborted due to a technical glitch, those aware of the issue said. The cricketers boarded the aircraft and waited for an alternative arrangement for five hours.

Indigo, in a statement, said the cricketers were taken to Kanpur by road from where they boarded another flight. Attempts were made to bring in another special flight but it could not materialise due to visibility issues at Kanpur airport, the statement said.

It said the special flight 6E227/3528 of Indigo landed at 2:40PM for the departure of players who participated in RSW22. The flight was grounded due to technical reasons before take-off. The passengers were deboarded from the flight.

COURT AWARDS DEATH TO FATHER, SON FOR KILLING A MAN AND HIS SON

LUCKNOW: The fast track court of the Lucknow district court on Friday awarded a death sentence to a father-son duo, who had murdered a father and a son around 17 years ago in April 2005 near the Baya Mayfair crossing in Hazratganj.

The court also imposed a fine of Rs five lakh each on the two accused.

Special judge Phool Chandra Khushwa awarded the death sentence to Vijay Prakash Sharma and his son Dheeraj Kumar Gupta for the killing of Kapil Gupta, in broad daylight, on April 16, 2005, over a property dispute. The murder took place on the first floor of the then Basant cinema hall.

The court observed that the two accused had caused irreparable loss to the Gupta family by the loss of two members — a father and a son.

The court added that a life sentence in this case would be inappropriate and justice would not be served. **HRC**

LUCKNOW: The Oudh Bar Association (OBA) of the Lucknow bench of the Allahabad high court is seeking support of Bar associations of 20 high courts across the country on the issue of opposing any decision to elevate lawyers of the Delhi high court and the apex court to the post of judges of high courts across the country.

Lawyers of the Lucknow bench of the Allahabad high court boycotted work on Friday in protest against the Allahabad high court collegium recommending to the Supreme Court the names of four lawyers, who are practising in the Delhi high court, for elevation as judges of

LAWYERS ABSTAIN FROM JUDICIAL WORK AT HC PRAYAGRAJ: The lawyers of high court abstained from judicial work after lunch on Friday as a mark of protest against the proposal to elevate certain advocates as high court judges, who had been practising law not before the high court but before the Supreme Court.

These four Delhi high court lawyers are among the 16 names recommended by the Allahabad high court collegium to the top court.

"We are roping in Bar Associ-

ations of all high courts across the country on this issue. Letters are being written to presidents of 20 Bar Associations of high courts across the country to seek their support on this issue," said OBA president Rakesh Kumar Chaudhary.

"Only advocates practising in a particular high court can be elevated as a judge of that high court and not a lawyer practising in any other high court," Chaudhary said.

The lawyers' associations of 16 district courts under the jurisdiction of the Lucknow bench of the Allahabad high court as well as the Bar Council of Uttar Pradesh, an apex body of lawyers of the state, have also acted in support of OBA on the issue.

The OBA president had recently written a letter to CJI Justice D.Y. Chandrachud, requesting him not to elevate lawyers practising in the Delhi high court or Supreme Court to the post of judges of the Allahabad high court.

HOUSES OF SEVEN ACCUSED JAILED FOR ASSAULTING WOMAN RAZED

KANPUR: The residential properties of the seven accused arrested for allegedly assaulting a woman and assaulting her in city forest area of Hamirpur before making the video viral last month were bulldozed on Friday.

Police said all the seven accused, who are in jail, had their properties built on encroached land. Circle officers, Sadar, Ravi Prakash Singh said the houses were demolished after Nagar Palika, Hamirpur, found out that the land on which the houses were built was illegally occupied. "The Nagar Palika's anti-encroachment team razed the houses," he said.

The police had arrested eight people on August 17, a day after the video of a woman being assaulted surfaced. A woman who was with a male friend in the city forest area was surrounded by a group of men.

In the video, these men were purportedly seen beating, abusing and stripping her besides making a rape bid. Following it, the police identified all the people in the video and arrested eight. At least four, who are named in the FIR, are yet to be arrested. During the probe, the houses of seven of the eight arrested accused were found to be built on encroached land. Heavy police contingents were sent there with the anti-encroachment team.

{ MOTHER OF DALIT SISTERS APPEALS TO VISITORS }

'Huang accused the same way they hanged my daughters'

LUCKHIMPUR KHERI: An eerie silence prevailed in the village of the two Dalit sisters, aged 15 and 17, who were found hanging from a tree in a sugarcane field a kilometre away from their home under the Nighasian police station limits on Wednesday.

Even at the district administration deployed a dozen police personnel at the house of the deceased to maintain law and order, a few visitors met the bereaved family amid incessant rains. The girls' mother appealed to the visitors to understand the same way as they hanged my daughters.

BIP district president Sunil Singh, along with Nighasian MLAs Shashank Kumar and the girls' kin and assured them all help.

An 11-member delegation of the Congress comprising MLAs Aradhana Mishra 'Mona' and Virendra Chaudhary, former MP Zafar Ali Naqvi, former MLA Satish Kumar, UPCC general secretary Abhishek Patel, UPCC SC/ST cell chairman Tanuj Punia, UPCC women's cell member Mamta Chaudhary and others expressed solidarity with the family.

Similar silence prevailed in Lalpur village - the native place of the accused, who were arrested on Thursday.

"Junaid, Suhail and Hafeezur Rehman were reportedly arrested during an encounter with the Nighasian police and the SWAT team in the Nighasian police station area on Thursday morning. Following their interrogation, the other accused Karimuddin, A and Chhotu Gautam were also arrested."

50% COMPENSATION AMOUNT GIVEN TO KHERI VICTIMS' MOTHER

A compensation of Rs 25 lakh had been transferred to the bank account of the mother while proceedings for the payment of the remaining amount were in progress.

CM Yogi Adityanath had announced Rs 25 lakh compensation, a pucca house and agricultural land for the bereaved family. He also assured of punishment to the accused within a month.

Kheri district magistrate Mahendra Bahadur Singh told media persons on Friday that

As according to the villagers, the five youths - Junaid, Sohail, Hafeezur Rehman, Karimuddin and Arif were educated up to High School level and belonged to poor families.

Police mull slapping NSA on six accused; SIT formed

LUCKNOW: The UP Police is mulling over invoking the stringent National Security Act (NSA) against the six men arrested for the alleged rape and murder of two Dalit sisters in Nighasian police station limits in Lakhimpur Kheri on Wednesday.

The sisters, aged 15 and 17, were found hanging from a tree in a sugarcane field a kilometre away from their house.

The NSA allows detention of people up to one year without any charge.

"We are mulling to impose the NSA on the six accused and a report in this regard will be sent to the district magistrate. Apart from this, DNA samples of the six accused men and the two girls will also be sent for forensic examination," said Sanjeev Suman, SP (Lakhimpur Kheri).

He added, "DNA samples of the victims and accused have been sent to the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) in Lucknow, for further examination and analysis. Police remand of the accused would be sought, if required."

Sources in the police department said that electronic surveillance established the presence of the accused on the spot of crime besides their relationship with the deceased sisters.

HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION CHIEF DEMANDS REPORT ON KHERI INCIDENT

LUCKNOW: Chairman of the Human Rights Commission (SHRC) Justice Bala Krishna Narayan on Friday took cognizance of the alleged rape and murder of two Dalit sisters in Nighasian police station limits of Lakhimpur Kheri district and sought a report of the incident from the circle

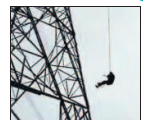
Kheri). He said none of the accused was a minor, dismissing a plea by some of them making the claim.
